The Tower Will Yet Fall!



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Beresheeth 6:11-13 Restoration Scriptures True Name Edition 11 The earth also was corrupt before Elohim, and the earth was filled with violence.

- 12 And Elohim looked upon the earth, and, see, it was corrupt; for all flesh had corrupted its way upon the earth.
- 13 And Elohim said to Noach, *The end of all flesh has come before Me; for the earth is filled with violence through them; and, see, I will destroy them with the earth.*

The Sages explain that the people had sinned through the performance of idol worship and sexual immorality. The core of their sin, then, was their increased inclinations toward base physical gratification. Unbridled craving for sexual pleasure and for wealth was what brought the world to such a depraved moral level that complete destruction became the only rectification possible. This open door led to cohabitation with fallen angels.

When we reflect, upon the iniquity of the generation which sprang up after the Flood - the generation of the Tower of Babel - we encounter a different sort of corruption: "And all of earth was of one language, with "uniform words, or one speech, or CONFESSION" (Beresheeth 11:1). The [negative] actions of the generation of the flood were revealed clearly to us in the Scriptures, while the actions of the generation of the Tower of Babel were not. "With uniform words'-They made sharp remarks concerning the following Biblical concepts: 'The Master our YHWH, the Master is one. "Concerning 'Abraham They said, 'Abraham is a fruitless grain, he produces no offspring.'

Their sin was a lack of belief in the Shema and a lack of belief in the covenant promise of the physical multiplicity of Yisrael into all nations. (Beresheeth 11:4) A name of your choice. Not YHWH! Also an attempt to avoid taking truth to the nations by planting roots in one place. The construction was an attack against the covenant and the messenger of the covenant. Avraham!

In rebellion they constructed a tower to show that there are many elohim (polytheism) and that all humanity can be concentrated in one place rather than all Abraham's seed in all the world. YHWH desired the settlement of the entire world as Yisrael, as opposed to concentration in one place. YHWH did not desire the creation of a world in which all of its inhabitants were similar, possessing the same personality, and of one way of wrong thinking. That sort of world would be monotonous, corrosive, lacking the power of fertility and perfection, and therefore not glorifying its maker.

The tower was an attack on the sovereignty of YHWH. Nimrod desired Avraham's death and the death of Avraham's new-found "Shema confession" according to **Sefer Yahshar**. As such he hid in a cave with Terach for 10 years from Nimrod while Nimrod was hunting him. While the building was going on Avraham was learning Torah from Noach in his home! **Sefer Yahshar 9:9-11.** In 9:23 it says that 600,000 joined Nimrod to build the tower, the same number that was later to be righteous Yisrael exiting Mitzrayim. s.a.tan set up a counter faith one-world religion denying YHWH and His covenant to Yisrael designed to hunt down destroy faithful Yahwists! Sound familiar?

"And regarding 'the Shema The Master our YHWH,' they would say, Who is He that He chooses the heavens for Himself and gives us ONLY the earth? Come, let us build a tower and construct an idol on its top, and place a sword in its hand, so that it appears to be doing battle with Him." (Beresheeth Rabba 38:6)

The root of the corruption: rebellion and apostasy with regard to YHWH's providential rule in the world - "Who is He that He chooses the heavens for Himself?"

The sin of the generation of the Tower of Babel represents spiritual rebellion and denial of YHWH's rule in the world. This was a war against the idea which Abraham began to make known to the world by evangelism- the faith in one YHWH, and in the oneness of all of creation under His rule. These tendencies have not disappeared from our world and the struggle against them continues even until today. The sin of Bavel was hatred of YHWH without a cause. Sefer Yahshua speaks of the men shooting arrows at YHWH as they built. It was a hatred for the Almighty and His sovereignty among men.

Today have some who confess and profess Torah also built a Tower of Bavel by hating Yahshua without a cause. John 15:25, John 15:18, Luke 19:14. Or by hating the real Yahshua coming in YHWH's Name and settling for the abomination that makes Hebraic truths desolate! Mattityahu 24:15, and Thesloniqyah 2.
